

Roadmaps for Music Department minors

These roadmaps do not account for GE coursework or courses in a major, but typically a student would start a minor in either the sophomore or junior year of a four-year program. Students starting a minor early may decide to spread the coursework out, but should consult the CSUSB Bulletin of Courses for course prerequisites and also the rotation of music courses available in the Music Department's handbook under "Curriculum."

**** Recommended electives are MUS 351 *Latin American Music* or 309 *Jazz History in America*, or students can pursue additional units in performing ensembles (MUS 380 thru 389, 391, 392, or 397).
